Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 7, 2018

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments during the period ended March 31, 2018, that have affected the ETF's performance and outlook. If the ETF was established during the period, "period" represents the period from inception to the end of the fiscal period. For information on the ETF's longer-term performance, as applicable, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report. In this report, "Mackenzie" refers to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the ETF. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the ETF as calculated for subscription and redemption purposes, on which the discussion of ETF performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The ETF seeks a steady flow of income with an emphasis on capital preservation by investing primarily in investment grade Canadian government, corporate fixed income and/or asset-backed securities, in each case with maturities of more than one year, and may hold up to 30% of its assets in foreign investments.

Risk

The risks of investing in the ETF remain as discussed in the ETF's Prospectus.

The ETF is suitable for short- to medium-term investors looking for a Canadian bond fund to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of bond markets and who have a low tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

During the year, the ETF returned 2.0% (after deducting fees and expenses). This compares with the FTSE TMX Canada Universe Bond Index return of 1.4%. All index returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in the index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

The Canadian bond market lagged the broader global bond market during the year. After raising its policy rate three times in response to robust economic data, the Bank of Canada put further increases on hold amid uncertainty prompted by threatened U.S. tariffs and a slowdown in household borrowing. The Canadian yield curve flattened as yields on shorter- and medium-term bonds rose significantly relative to longer-term bonds. The high-yield bond market had positive total returns, with all returns coming from interest payments.

The ETF outperformed the index primarily due to its duration and yield curve positioning within federal bonds. Conversely, security selection and duration positioning within corporate bonds detracted from performance.

The ETF hedged its foreign currency exposure, which contributed to absolute performance primarily as the U.S. dollar depreciated relative to the Canadian dollar.

Over the year, portfolio activity and market effect resulted in increased exposure to the United States. At the sector level, exposure to federal bonds, term loans and foreign government bonds increased, while exposure to corporate bonds decreased.

Net Assets

The ETF's NAV increased by 475.6% to \$52.3 million at March 31, 2018, from \$9.1 million at March 31, 2017. This change was composed primarily of \$0.4 million in net income (including dividend and interest income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, \$43.6 million in net sales, and \$0.8 million in cash distributions.

Recent Developments

The portfolio management team believes there is some uncertainty as to whether the U.S. Federal Reserve, under new chair Jerome Powell, will be sensitive to market volatility in its messaging and actions. The market continues to anticipate two to three more increases in the federal funds rate in 2018. With U.S. economic growth likely to remain solid, the team believes the Federal Reserve will pursue this path unless volatility increases or economic data is disappointing. In Canada, the team believes growing business confidence strengthens the case for another policy rate increase in July.

If more rate increases occur in either the United States or Canada, the team expects the yield curve to continue flattening as shorter-term yields rise.

The team is maintaining the ETF's overweight allocation to corporate bonds and continues to improve the credit quality of its corporate bond exposure, which may help mitigate risk from potential market declines.

Related Party Transactions

The following arrangements result in fees paid by the ETF to Mackenzie or to companies affiliated with the ETF.

Management Fees

The management expense ratio ("MER") for the ETF of 0.61% during the year ended March 31, 2018, was slightly lower than the annualized MER of 0.64% for the period ended March 31, 2017. The ETF paid management fees to Mackenzie at the annual rate of 0.55%.

The management fee for the ETF is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The ETF's management fees were used by Mackenzie to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the ETF, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio and providing other services, and to pay for all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs as more fully described in the Prospectus) required to operate the ETF.

Other Related Party Transactions

Investment funds managed by Mackenzie invest in the ETF in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. At March 31, 2018, funds managed by Mackenzie owned 4.0% of the ETF's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the current market price.

The ETF did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions.

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
Past Performance

The ETF's past performance information is presented in the following chart and table. It assumes all distributions made by the ETF in the periods presented are reinvested in additional units of the ETF. (2) Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. If the ETF was established in the period, the management expense ratio is annualized from the date of inception. Mackenzie may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.

(3) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. Mackenzie may reimburse the ETF for certain brokerage commissions and other transaction costs (including those payable to the custodian or its agents). Mackenzie may make these reimbursements at its discretion and stop these reimbursements at any time without notice.

(4) The ETF's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the ETF's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the ETF buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher an ETF's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the ETF in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of an ETF. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the ETF is less than one year old.

(5) Closing market price, or the midpoint of the bid and ask prices in the absence of a closing market price, on the last trading day of the period as reported on the Toronto Stock Exchange.



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
