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## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 13, 2018

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments during the period ended September 30, 2018, that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook. If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period from inception to the end of the fiscal period. For information on the Fund's longer-term performance, as applicable, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report. In this report, "Mackenzie" refers to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

### Results of Operations

#### Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund's Series A securities is discussed below. The performance of all series is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Where series returns differ, it is primarily because different levels of fees and expenses were charged to each series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series.

During the period, the Fund's Series A securities returned 0.9% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 5.5% for a blended index composed of a 50% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the S&P 500 Index (returned 11.8%), and a 50% weighting in the ICE BofAML US Broad Market (Hedged) Index (returned -0.5%). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in the index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

U.S. equity markets rose over the period, driven in part by strong corporate earnings. Markets reached record highs despite higher bond yields and increased trade tensions with several key trading partners. The U.S. dollar appreciated relative to the Canadian dollar. The U.S. Federal Reserve raised the federal funds rate in June and September, and suggested that gradual rate increases were likely to continue through 2019.

Within the S&P 500 Index, health care, consumer discretionary and information technology were the strongest sectors in Canadian dollar terms, while financials, materials and consumer staples were the weakest.

Performance varied across global government bond markets over the period, but in general yields rose across the curve. Shorter-term yields increased significantly, causing yield curves to flatten, particularly in Canada and the United States. As economic data improved, central banks in Canada, the United States, the United Kingdom and Norway raised their policy rates. Emerging market bonds underperformed as a result of the strong U.S. dollar. The Canadian dollar was volatile as the benefit of a

robust economy was offset by trade concerns. A generally strong global economy, low default rates and low issuance late in the period led to positive returns from high-yield bonds.

The following discussion reflects the activities and performance of the Fund's underlying mutual funds and other directly held securities. The Fund underperformed both the broad-based and the blended index primarily because of the underperformance of its equity holdings. The fixed income portion of the Fund outperformed the ICE BofAML US Broad Market (Hedged) Index. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

Within the equity portion of the Fund, stock selection in the information technology, health care and consumer staples sectors detracted from performance. Conversely, stock selection in industrials and materials contributed, as did stock selection and an overweight position in the energy sector.

Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, exposure to high-yield bonds and term loans contributed to performance, in part because of their shorter duration as yields rose. Conversely, exposure to U.S. Treasury bonds with longer duration than the index detracted from performance, although this impact was partially offset by an underweight position. A high cash position also detracted from performance.

Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, foreign currency exposure was largely hedged. Small exposures to several currencies that depreciated relative to the Canadian dollar detracted marginally from performance.

Over the period, portfolio activity and market effect resulted in increased exposure to equities and decreased exposure to fixed income. Within the equity portion of the Fund, exposure to the health care and consumer staples sectors increased, while exposure to consumer discretionary and materials decreased. Within the fixed income portion of the fund, exposure to foreign government bonds decreased.

#### Net Assets

The Fund's NAV increased by 4.2% to \$2.1 million at September 30, 2018, from \$2.0 million at March 31, 2018. This change was composed primarily of \$0.1 million in net sales.

See *Other Related Party Transactions* for the percentage of the Fund's NAV owned by related parties. As a result of these investments, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors.

#### Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for Series A of 2.40% during the period ended September 30, 2018, was unchanged from the annualized MER for the period ended March 31, 2018. The MERs (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) for each series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report. The MERs for Series F, Series F8, Series PW, Series PWFB and Series PWT8 decreased due to a decrease in the management and/or administration fee rates effective June 1, 2018, as



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noted in the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of the report. The MERs for Series AR, Series D and Series T8 decreased due to a decrease in fund costs.

## **Recent Developments**

The equity portfolio management team believes that, given its long-term time horizon and focus on high-quality companies, the Fund may benefit from market volatility. The team will attempt to take advantage of any volatility as it occurs by purchasing undervalued holdings in companies that in the team's view have a positive long-term outlook.

With strong economic growth in North America, particularly in the United States, corporate credit spreads (the difference in yield between investment grade and high-yield bonds of similar maturities) narrowed over the period. As company profitability and cash flow remain healthy, the fixed income portfolio management team believes there are few near-term debt servicing risks, even as debt levels across the corporate sector rise.

In the team's opinion, unless U.S. domestic market volatility and economic risks rise notably, the Federal Reserve is likely to increase the federal funds rate by December. The team expects this to flatten the yield curve further. Now that a North American trade deal has been negotiated, the team believes the Bank of Canada will also raise its policy rate, although more slowly than its U.S. counterpart due to its concerns about high levels of household debt.

Effective June 1, 2018, Series PWF securities were consolidated into Series F securities and Series PWF8 securities were consolidated into Series F8 securities.

## **Related Party Transactions**

The following arrangements result in fees paid by the Fund to Mackenzie or to companies affiliated with the Fund.

## **Management and Administration Services**

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to Mackenzie at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, Mackenzie pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

## **Other Related Party Transactions**

At September 30, 2018, Mackenzie had an investment of \$1.0 million in the Fund (48.6% of the Fund's NAV). If Mackenzie decides to redeem its investment, it will do so in a manner that reduces the possibility of adverse effects on the Fund.

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions.



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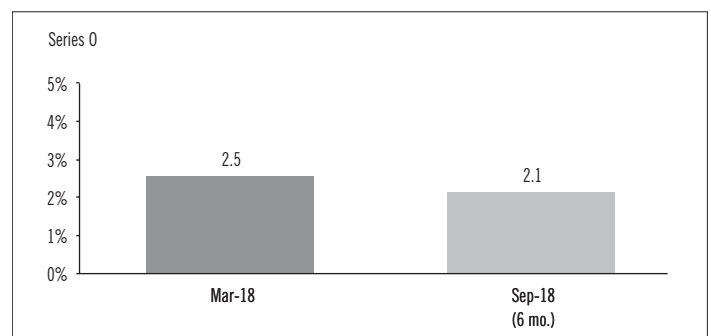
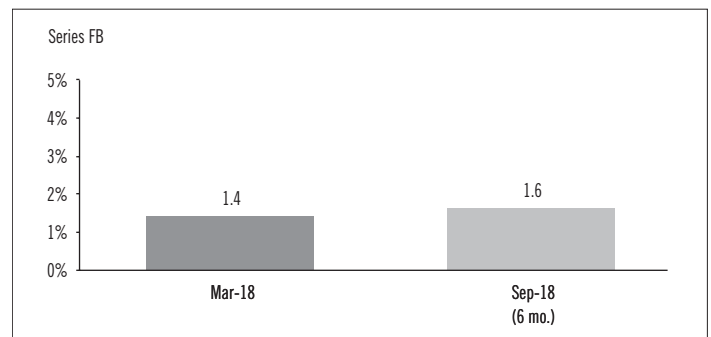
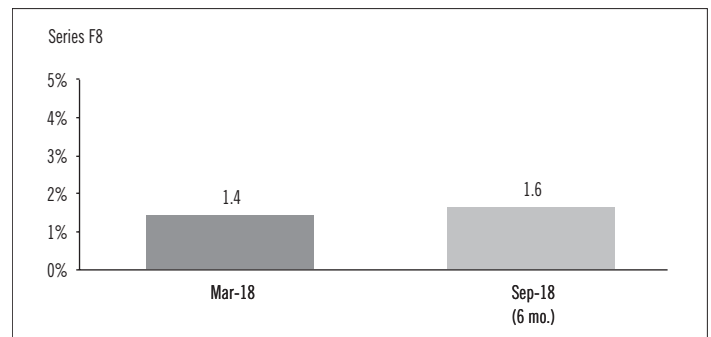
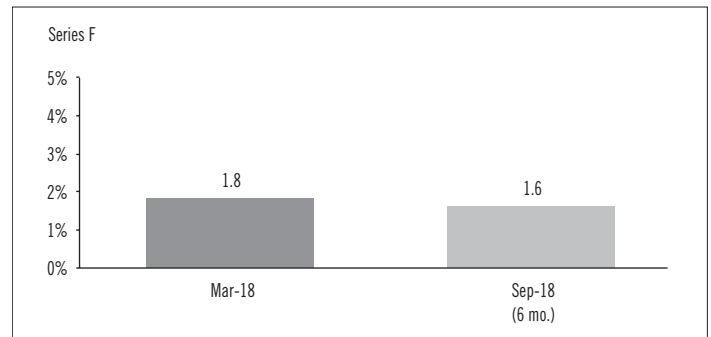
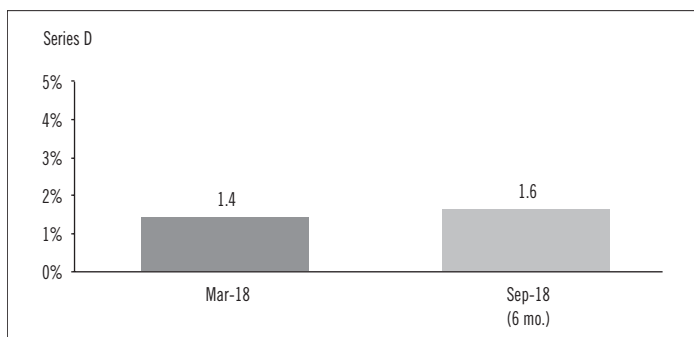
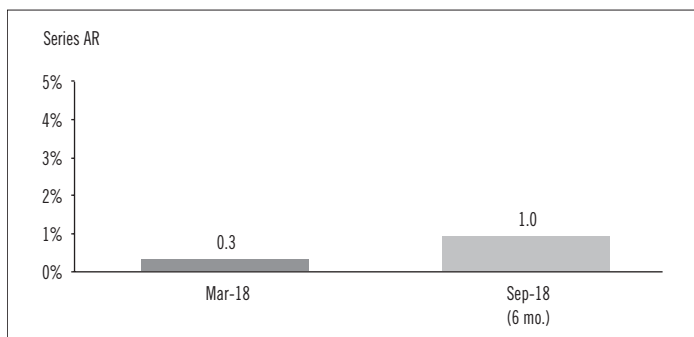
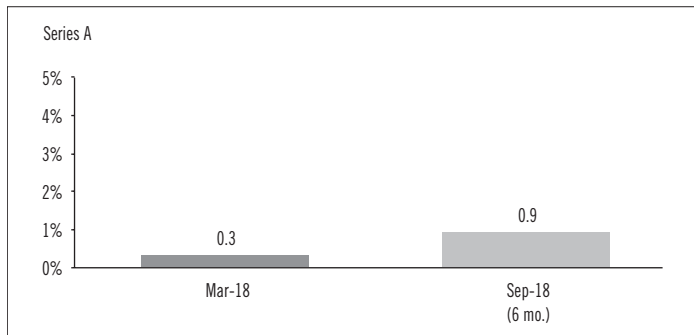
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## Past Performance

## Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by Mackenzie to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. Mackenzie also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with Mackenzie may be entitled to distribution-related payments from Mackenzie on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

Mackenzie used approximately 43% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 60% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series. The higher proportion of distribution-related payments is primarily attributable to sales commissions related to gross sales of redemption charge securities of the Fund.

Series AR securities are offered to retail investors in a Registered Disability Savings Plan offered by Mackenzie.

Series D securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500 through a discount brokerage or other account approved by Mackenzie. Investors in Series D securities also want to receive a regular monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series F and Series F8 securities are offered to investors who are enrolled in a dealer-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program, who are subject to an asset-based fee rather than commissions on each transaction and who invest at least \$500 (\$5,000 for Series F8); they are also available to employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries, and directors of Mackenzie. Investors in Series F and Series F8 securities also want to receive a regular monthly cash flow of 5% and 8% per year, respectively.

Series FB securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series FB securities also want to receive a regular monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series O securities are offered only to investors investing a minimum of \$500,000 who are enrolled in Mackenzie Portfolio Architecture Service or Open Architecture Service; certain institutional investors; and certain qualifying employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries. Investors in Series O securities also want to receive a regular monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series PW and Series PWT8 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors in Series PW and Series PWT8 securities also want to receive a regular monthly cash flow of 5% and 8% per year, respectively.

Series PWFB securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series PWFB securities also want to receive a regular monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series PWX and Series PWX8 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series PWX and Series PWX8 securities also want to receive a regular monthly cash flow of 5% and 8% per year, respectively.

Series PWF and Series PWF8 securities are no longer available for sale. Effective June 1, 2018, Series PWF and Series PWF8 securities were consolidated into Series F and Series F8 securities, respectively.

An investor in the Fund may choose among different purchase options that are available under each series. These purchase options are a sales charge purchase option, a redemption charge purchase option and various low-load purchase options. The charges under the sales charge purchase option are negotiated by investors with their dealers. The charges under the redemption charge and low-load purchase options are paid to Mackenzie if an investor redeems securities of the Fund during specific periods. Not all purchase options are available under each series of the Fund, and the charges for each purchase option may vary among the different series.
