## **Management Discussion of Fund Performance**

June 7, 2018

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments during the period ended March 31, 2018, that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook. If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period from inception to the end of the fiscal period. For information on the Fund's longer-term performance, as applicable, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report. In this report, "Mackenzie" refers to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

## Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks a steady stream of income with some emphasis on capital preservation by investing primarily in exchange-traded funds to gain exposure to Canadian and foreign equity and fixed income securities and other asset categories. The Fund may also invest in other mutual funds or in securities directly. The Fund's asset mix will generally range between 15%–35% equities and 65%–85% fixed income securities. The Fund diversifies in terms of geographic exposure, equity factor exposure, sector exposure, company market capitalization, investment style, credit quality and duration.

### Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for medium-term investors looking for a managed asset portfolio fund to hold as a key part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of stock and bond markets, and who have a low tolerance for risk.

## Results of Operations

#### **Investment Performance**

The performance of the Fund's Series A securities is discussed below. The performance of all series is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Where series returns differ, it is primarily because different levels of fees and expenses were charged to each series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series.

From the Fund's inception on January 29, 2018, to March 31, 2018, the Fund's Series A securities returned -0.7% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 0.8% for the Fund's broad-based index, the FTSE TMX Canada Universe Bond Index, and a return of -0.3% for a blended index for the same period.\* All index and

\* The blended index is composed of a 65% weighting in the FTSE TMX Canada Universe Bond Index (returned 0.8%), a 12.5% weighting in the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index (returned -3.1%), a 12.5% weighting in the S&P/TSX Composite Index (returned -4.0%) and a 10% weighting in the ICE BofAML Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index (returned 0.4%).

series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in the index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Developed global bond market returns varied over the period, with the Canadian market outperforming. The sovereign bond markets of the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom and Germany saw their yield curves flatten as long-term yields fell or remained unchanged, while short-term yields remained unchanged or rose.

Global equity markets were volatile over the period as a result of global trade tensions, rising inflation and the removal of monetary stimulus by central banks. In local currency terms, all major equity markets were negative, with the Canadian market falling less than most other foreign markets. However, as most foreign currencies appreciated relative to the Canadian dollar, Canadian equity market returns lagged in Canadian dollar terms.

Within the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index, Egypt, Finland and the Czech Republic were the strongest performers in Canadian dollar terms in the period, while Greece, Poland and the Philippines were the weakest. From a sector perspective, utilities, real estate and information technology were the strongest performers, while materials, energy and health care were the weakest.

Within the S&P/TSX Composite Index, information technology, real estate and industrials were the strongest sectors in the period, while health care, energy and consumer staples were the weakest.

The Fund currently invests all its assets in exchange-traded funds ("ETFs") managed by Mackenzie, and the following discussion reflects the activities of these underlying ETFs. The Fund underperformed the broad-based index primarily because of its allocation to equities, which underperformed fixed income over the period. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

The Fund underperformed the blended index primarily because most of its exposure to the U.S. dollar was hedged as the U.S. dollar appreciated relative to the Canadian dollar.

Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, duration positioning in corporate bonds within the industrial, communication and energy sectors detracted from performance.

Within the equity portion of the Fund, an underweight position and stock selection in the information technology sector detracted from performance, as did overweight exposure to India. Conversely, an underweight position and stock selection in the United States contributed to performance, as did stock selection in Japan and China and in the health care sector.

#### **Net Assets**

From its inception on January 29, 2018, to March 31, 2018, the Fund experienced net sales of \$1.2 million.

At March 31, 2018, 19.5% of the Fund's NAV was held by investors that individually owned 10% or more of the Fund. See also *Other Related Party Transactions* for the percentage of the Fund's NAV owned by Mackenzie. As a result of these investments, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the



possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions. At March 31, 2018, Mackenzie had received no such notices.

### **Fees and Expenses**

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for Series A was 1.66% since inception. The MERs (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) for each series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

### Recent Developments

The Mackenzie Asset Allocation team believes that global growth will slow while remaining strong, although some risk factors have emerged. In the United States, rising fiscal deficits, a strong economy, employment near full capacity and tighter monetary policy from the U.S. Federal Reserve are likely to put upward pressure on yields, in the team's opinion. In addition, rhetoric surrounding trade policy has escalated. The implementation of significant trade restrictions and tariffs could disrupt global trade and the economic cycle.

In Europe, strong growth and falling unemployment moved the European Central Bank closer to ending its ultra-easy monetary policy; its statement no longer references a possible extension of its bond-buying program.

In Canada, the team expects growth to moderate and gradually return to its long-term trend. Key risks to growth include uncertainty related to the renegotiation of the North American Free Trade Agreement, higher-than-expected inflation, elevated household debt and the housing market slowdown.

Effective June 1, 2018, Series PWF securities were consolidated into Series F securities, and Series PWF5 securities were consolidated into Series F5 securities.

### Related Party Transactions

The following arrangements result in fees paid by the Fund to Mackenzie or to companies affiliated with the Fund.

### **Management and Administration Services**

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to Mackenzie at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, Mackenzie pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not otherwise included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

### **Other Related Party Transactions**

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions.

At March 31, 2018, Mackenzie had an investment of \$0.2 million in the Fund (13.2% of the Fund's NAV). If Mackenzie decides to redeem its investment, it will do so in a manner that reduces the possibility of adverse effects on the Fund.


### **Past Performance**





















### **Annual Compound Returns**

The blended index is composed of 65% FTSE TMX Canada Universe Bond Index, 12.5% MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index, 12.5% S&P/TSX Composite Index and 10% ICE BofAML Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index.

The FTSE TMX Canada Universe Bond Index is a broad measure of Canadian bonds with terms to maturity of more than one year. It includes federal, provincial, municipal and corporate bonds rated "BBB" or higher.

The MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index is a free float adjusted, market capitalization weighted index that is designed to measure the equity market performance of developed and emerging markets. The index consists of 23 developed and 23 emerging market country indices. Net total returns are after the deduction of withholding tax from the foreign income and dividends of its constituents.

The S&P/TSX Composite Index is a capitalization weighted index that represents some of the largest float adjusted stocks trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange. The ICE BofAML Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index tracks the performance of investment grade debt publicly issued in the major domestic and eurobond markets, including sovereign, quasi-government, corporate, securitized and collateralized securities. Qualifying bonds must be rated "BBB" or higher and have a remaining term to maturity of at least one year. The foreign currency exposure is hedged back to the Canadian dollar.

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by Mackenzie to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. Mackenzie also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with Mackenzie may be entitled to distribution-related payments from Mackenzie on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

Mackenzie used approximately 43% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the year to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 94% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series. The higher proportion of distribution-related payments is primarily attributable to sales commissions related to gross sales of redemption charge securities of the Fund. Because the Fund is in its first year, the percentage of management fees used to fund such distribution-related payments is not representative.

Series AR securities are offered to retail investors in a Registered Disability Savings Plan offered by Mackenzie.

Series D securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500 through a discount brokerage or other account approved by Mackenzie.

Series F and Series F5 securities are offered to investors who are enrolled in a dealer-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program, who are subject to an asset-based fee rather than commissions on each transaction and who invest at least \$500 (\$5,000 for Series F5); they are also available to employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries, and directors of Mackenzie. Investors in Series F5 securities also want to receive a regular monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series FB and Series FB5 securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series FB5 securities also want to receive a regular monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series O securities are offered only to investors investing a minimum of \$500,000 who have an account with Mackenzie Private Wealth Counsel; certain institutional investors; and certain qualifying employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries.

Series PW and Series PWT5 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors in Series PWT5 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series PWF and Series PWF5 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who are enrolled in a dealer-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program, who are subject to an asset-based fee rather than commissions on each transaction and who invest at least \$100,000. Investors in Series PWF5 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year. Effective June 1, 2018, Series PWF and Series PWF5 securities were consolidated into Series F and Series F5 securities, respectively.

Series PWFB and Series PWFB5 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series PWFB5 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series PWX and Series PWX5 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series PWX5 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

An investor in the Fund may choose among different purchase options that are available under each series. These purchase options are a sales charge purchase option, a redemption charge purchase option and various low-load purchase options. The charges under the sales charge purchase option are negotiated by investors with their dealers. The charges under the redemption charge and low-load purchase options are paid to Mackenzie if an investor redeems securities of the Fund during specific periods. Not all purchase options are available under each series of the Fund, and the charges for each purchase option may vary among the different series.
